Frequently Asked Questions



**1. When will my lab results be available?**

Routine test results will be available in three to five days; STAT results will be available same day and some specialized tests may take up to 10 days.

**2. How can my testing be done STAT?**

The ordering physician may request your lab tests STAT if he/she feels your condition warrants it.

**3. How will my doctor get my results?**

Results are either sent electronically, via printer, U.S. Mail or delivered by courier.

**4. Can my results be faxed to my physician?**

Yes, lab results can be faxed to your physician and this request must be noted on the script or requisition form. If you see an Abington – Jefferson Health Physician, results will be forwarded electronically.

**5. How can I obtain a copy of my results?**

Patients may pick up copies of their lab results in the Lab Access Center on the first floor of Abington Hospital – Jefferson Health. Proof of ID is required. Please call in advance to 215-481-8977 so that your results will be ready for you. At Abington – Lansdale Hospital, go to the Outpatient Lab with your ID.

**6. May I have a copy of my lab tests sent to a second physician?**

Lab results can be sent to other physicians at your request. Notify the registrar at the time of registration. At Abington – Lansdale Hospital, you can request a second physician be notified by letting the phlebotomist drawing your blood know of your request.

**7. Do you accept appointments for blood draws?**

Abington – Jefferson Health does not schedule appointments for routine blood draws. Routine blood draws are done on a walk-in basis. Only Glucose Tolerance Tests or Cortrisyn Simulation Tests are scheduled lab tests. To make an appointment for one of these specialized tests, call **215-481-EXAM** (3926). Only multiple-hour Glucose Tolerance Tests are scheduled at Abington – Lansdale Hospital – call **215-361-4711**.
